FALSE NARRATIVE CREATED OVER GODHRA RIOTS: PM

Interacting with pod-caster Lex Fridman, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday spoke about the Godhra incident, where people were burned alive, calling it “a tragedy of unimaginable magnitude”.

He said that the Godhra train burning incident, where 59 people died, occurred when he was seated in the Gujarat assembly for the budget session.

“On February 27, 2002, we were seated in the Assembly for the budget session. That same day, it had been just three days since I'd become a state representative when suddenly, the horrific Godhra incident occurred. It was a tragedy of unimaginable magnitude. People were burned alive. Of course, this

was tragic for everyone. Everyone prefers peace,” PM Modi said.

He said the discourse around the 2002 post-Godhra riots in Gujarat was an attempt to create a false narrative and his political opponents in power at the Centre wanted him to be punished but the courts cleared his name.

PM Modi said the perception that the 2002 riots were the biggest riots ever in Gujarat was an attempt to push misinformation.

“If you review the data from before 2002, you will see that Gujarat faced frequent riots. Curfews were constantly being imposed somewhere. Communal violence would erupt over trivial issues such as kite flying contests or even bicycle collisions,” Modi said.

The Prime Minister said

the riots in Gujarat in 1969 lasted for more than six months and that was an era when he was nowhere on the political horizon.

Modi said the Godhra train burning incident took place barely three days after he was elected as a legislator of the Gujarat Assembly.

“It was a tragedy of unimaginable magnitude, people were burned alive. You can imagine, against the backdrop of incidents like the Kandahar hijacking, the attack on Parliament, or even 9/11, and then to have so many people killed and burned alive, you can imagine how tense and volatile the situation was,” he said.

“Nothing should happen, we also wish so. Everyone would wish there should be peace,” the prime minister said during the podcast

emphasised that he embraced every phase of life with gratitude and never viewed poverty as a struggle.

LeT terrorist behind Rajouri attack shot dead in Pak

Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist Abu Qatal, chargesheeted by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) in connection with the January 2023 Rajouri attacks, has been shot dead in Pakistan after an assailant opened fire on his vehicle on the Mangla-Jhelum Road, local media reported on Sunday.

An armed guard of Qatal was also killed in the



attack that took place on Saturday night, according to a report in Islamabad-based outlet The News International.

At the time of the attack,

Abu Qatal, whose real name is Zia ur Rehman, was travelling in his black jeep, The News International reported. Both Qatal and his armed guard died on the spot.

Following the attack, the suspected assailant was apprehended, The News International reported, citing sources. However, there has been no official confirmation of the arrest.

3 Pak soldiers killed in Baloch attack

Five people, including three Frontier Corps (FC) personnel, were killed and 30 injured after a paramilitary convoy was attacked by suspected Baloch militants on a highway in Noshki district of restive Balochistan of Pakistan on Sunday.

The attack, in which three terrorists died, was claimed by the banned Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA), which hijacked the passenger train Jaffar Express last week.

A police official said evi-

dence from the site of the attack suggested that a suicide attacker rammed an explosive-laden vehicle

into the FC convoy on the Noshki-Dalbandin National Highway.

Three terrorists were

killed after the suicide bomber first rammed his motorcycle into the FC convoy. “After the blast, some other terrorists opened fire on the FC personnel but in the retaliatory firing, two of them were killed. Two civilians and three soldiers also died,” the police official said.

Noshki Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Hashim Momand said the blast was of high intensity, and injured at least 30 paramilitary soldiers, who have been moved to a hospital for treatment.

Govt announces one-time settlement scheme for farmers' loan relief

In a significant move, Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma has approved a one-time settlement (OTS) scheme for loans taken from land development banks. This decision, announced during the budget reply, is expected to provide major relief to farmers and small entrepreneurs while also strengthening the financial health of land development banks facing economic difficulties.

The cooperative land development banks of Rajasthan have played a crucial role in supporting agricultural and economic growth by offering long-term loans to farmers and small entrepreneurs. However, in recent years, natural disasters have impacted the repayment capabilities of many farmers, leading to overdue loans totalling approximately Rs 760 crores. To address this issue, the Chief Minister has intro-



duced the OTS scheme, allocating Rs 200 crores to facilitate the recovery of these loans and improve the banks' financial stability. **100% INTEREST RELIEF FOR FARMERS** Minister of State of Cooperative and Civil Aviation Gautam Dak emphasised that the government remains committed to protecting farmers from financial distress. 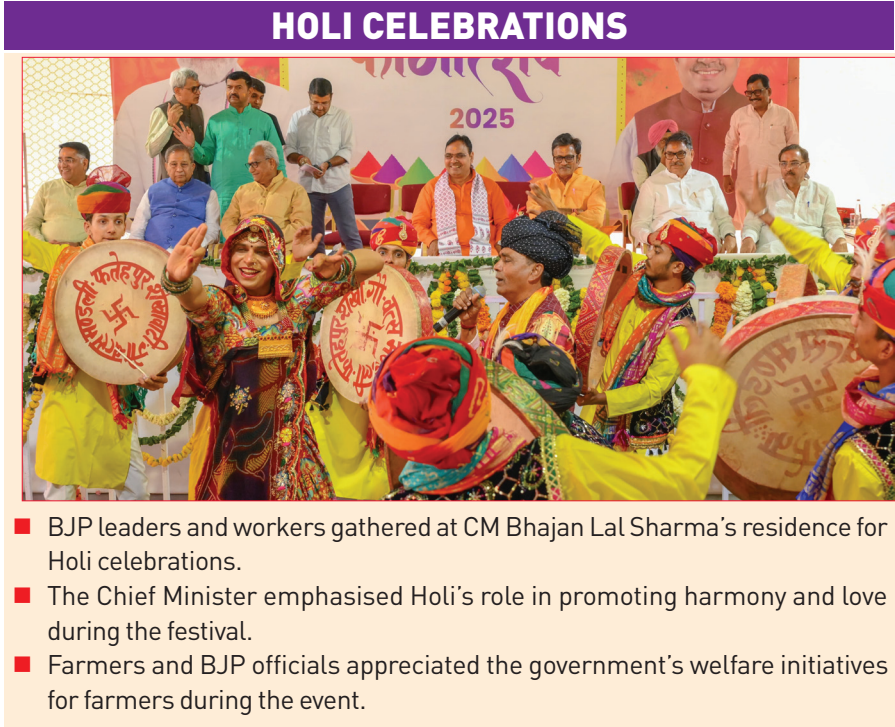

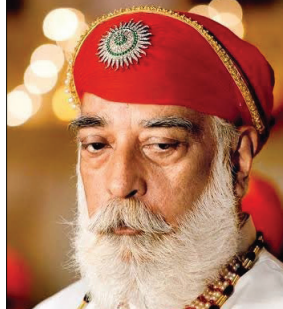

During his lifetime, Arvind Singh Mewar played a significant role in managing the properties of the former royal family. His father, Maharana Bhagwat Singh, had leased several royal properties between 1963 and 1983. This decision led to a legal dispute between him and

ya, who had given it to him on lease and instructed him to charge Rs 10 for five rotis. Dilawar expressed strong displeasure, stating that the government had introduced the Annapurna

kitchen scheme to provide full meals to the poor for Rs 8, while the government covered the remaining Rs 22 of the Rs 30 cost. He accused those involved of exploiting the poor by charging extra.

Taking immediate action, Dilawar called the District Collector of Kota and directed the cancellation of the Annapurna kitchen in Banda village.

During the Holi Milan event, the minister also announced Rs 10 lakhs for the construction of a community building in the village.

Meanwhile, he came across another case of administrative negligence in the village. A water cooler had been installed under his quota, with his photo and that of Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla affixed to it. However, despite being fully set up, the cooler remained non-functional as the officials had forgotten to install a tap.

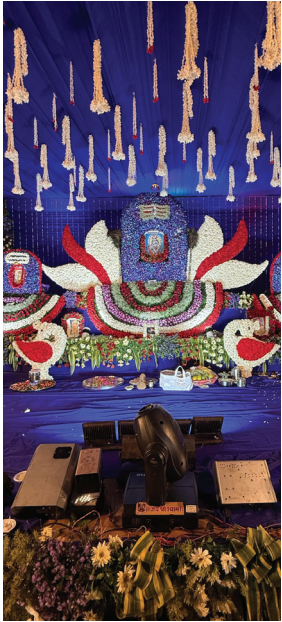

HOLI AROUND THE WORLD

A TRANSNATIONAL CELEBRATION OF CULTURAL SYNCRETISM AND SOCIAL COHESION

Holi, an ancient Hindu festival rooted in the Bhartiya subcontinent, has transcended its geographical and cultural origins to become a globally recognized phenomenon. Functioning as both a ritualistic observance and a social unifier, the festival epitomizes the syncretic interplay of tradition and modernity. In contemporary times, Holi has been reinterpreted and adapted by diverse communities worldwide, highlighting its role as a mechanism of cultural transmission, diasporic identity reinforcement, and intercultural solidarity. From the ritualistic commemorations in Nepal to the diaspora-driven celebrations in Mauritius, Fiji, and Australia, Holi continues to symbolize the transcendence of historical narratives into the realm of collective human festivity.

NEPAL: FAGU PURNIMA AND THE RITUALIZATION OF HOLI
In Nepal, Holi assumes the form of Fagu Purnima, an intricate amalgamation of religious devotion, historical tradition, and public rev-

elry. The commencement of the festival is marked by the erection of the 'Chir', a ceremonial bamboo pole adorned with colorful fabric, in Kathmandu's Basantapur Durbar Square. This symbolic act signifies the initiation of a week-long observance, which manifests in diverse forms across Nepal's topographically and culturally distinct regions.

The structural framework of Fagu Purnima is deeply entrenched in Nepalese sociocultural dynamics. In the hilly regions, Holi incorporates performative folk traditions, with regional variations in dance and musical expressions. The Terai plains, on the other hand, emphasize collective participation in vibrant processions, reflecting the cross-cultural intersections between Nepal and North India. Culinary traditions, including the preparation of sel roti and gujiya, further reinforce the festival's embeddedness in Nepalese heritage. The commemoration of Fagu Purnima underscores the integral role of Holi in preserving regional identities while facilitating intercommunal cohesion.

MAURITIUS: A DIASPORIC INTERPRETATION OF HOLI'S CULTURAL ETHOS
Mauritius, a nation with a substantial Indo-Mauritian population, celebrates Holi over two days, maintaining continuity with its subcontinental roots while

simultaneously embedding it within the island's multicultural framework. The first day, Holika Dahan, involves ritualistic bonfire ceremonies that symbolize the annihilation of malevolent forces, a practice derived from the Prahlad-Hiranyakashipu myths. The subsequent day transforms public spaces into arenas of color-laden revelry, with participants engaging in an effusive interplay of music, dance, and community interaction.

Mauritius' interpretation of Holi extends beyond its religious and mythological connotations. The island's celebration integrates elements of chowtaal music, a folk genre preserved by indentured laborer descendants, reflecting the diasporic retention of cultural heritage. Additionally, the participatory nature of the festival facilitates cross-cultural engagement, with non-Hindu Mauritians increasingly embracing the festival as an expression of national inclusivity. Holi in Mauritius thus exemplifies how diasporic communities negotiate between historical fidelity and contemporary multiculturalism.

FIJI: THE SOCIO-CULTURAL CONVERGENCE OF HOLI IN THE PACIFIC

In Fiji, Holi has evolved into a festival that embodies the principles of unity and social integration. Given the significant presence of Indo-Fijians, Holi celebrations extend into public institutions, particularly within educational spaces. Schools serve as focal points for the festival, where students engage in color play, folk performances, and thematic dramatizations based on the Holi mythology. These activities serve an educative function, ensuring the inter-

generational transmission of cultural knowledge while reinforcing communal harmony in Fiji's multi-ethnic society.

Holi in Fiji is characterized by a strong communal ethos. Temples, community centers, and familial spaces become sites of both ritualistic

devotion and social festivity. The emphasis on collective storytelling—wherein elders recount the allegorical narratives associated with Holi—strengthens the pedagogical function of the festival. Additionally, the integration of indigenous Fijian music and dance into Holi events high-

lights the festival's adaptive nature within a Pacific Island context, demonstrating how cultural traditions negotiate local specificities while maintaining their core symbolic meanings.

The transnational diffusion of Holi is particularly evident in the West, where

the festival has undergone significant transformation. In the United States, the Festival of Colors has emerged as a large-scale event that amalgamates elements of Indian tradition with contemporary entertainment culture. Organized in cities such as New York, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, these celebrations often feature Bollywood music, yoga sessions, and food stalls offering Indian delicacies. While the Indian diaspora remains a primary driver of these events, the increasing participation of non-Indian attendees indicates Holi's broader appeal as a festival of inclusivity and multicultural engagement.

In Europe, major metropolitan hubs such as London, Paris, and Amsterdam host Holi-themed festivals that emphasize cultural appreciation and interethnic participation. These events, often sponsored by Indian cultural organizations and tourism boards, contribute to the festival's global branding. However, the commercialization of Holi in Western settings has raised debates about the dilution of its spiritual essence, with critiques centering on its transformation into an aesthetic spectacle detached from its religious and historical underpinnings.

Australia provides a unique case study of Holi's integration into national multicultural discourse. The festival has received official recognition from Australian political leaders, with Prime Minister Anthony Albanese publicly acknowledging its significance. His statement underscores Holi's role in fostering intercommunal solidarity:

"Our country will continue to grow and thrive because of the bonds of friendship and understanding that we see so clearly in the celebrations surrounding Holi."

Such governmental en-

dorsements not only validate the festival's cultural relevance but also position it as an emblem of Australia's commitment to diversity. Australian Foreign Minister Penny Wong further reinforced this sentiment in her message to Indian External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar, highlighting the festival's ability to strengthen Indo-Australian ties.

CONCLUSION: HOLI AS A CASE STUDY IN CULTURAL TRANSNATIONALISM

Holi's global diffusion exemplifies the dynamics of cultural transnationalism, demonstrating how a localized festival can acquire international resonance through processes of migration, adaptation, and hybridization. From its mythological roots in the Indian subcontinent to its contemporary manifestations in global metropolises, Holi operates as both a site of ritualistic continuity and a platform for cross-cultural interaction.

As the festival continues to proliferate across diverse socio-political landscapes, its evolving interpretations offer insights into broader themes of diasporic identity, cultural commodification, and intercultural exchange. Holi's ability to bridge divides—whether geographic, religious, or social—attests to its enduring power as a celebration of unity, renewal, and shared humanity. The rise and fall of a delusional warlord

M.R. Narayan Swamy is no stranger to the Tamil insurgency in Sri Lanka. His earlier work, Inside an Elusive Mind, included in this volume, remains one of the most definitive accounts of Velupillai Prabhakaran, the founder of the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). In The Rout of Prabhakaran, he turns his attention to the final years of the Tamil Tigers, methodically dissecting how an organisation that once struck terror into the hearts of its enemies was wiped off the face of the earth.

This is not just a war story. It is an autopsy of a man and a movement that overestimated its strength, underestimated its enemies, and ultimately condemned

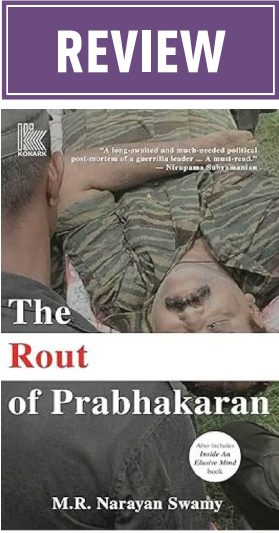
an entire people to suffering.

For many, Prabhakaran was an enigma. He was a man who inspired fanatical loyalty among his followers, a ruthless commander who demanded absolute discipline, and a zealot who believed in his own invincibility. Yet, he was also a paradox, a man who doted on his own children while sending thousands of Tamil boys and girls to die in battle. He forbade his cadres from falling in love, punishing violators with death, while he himself married the woman of his choice. He claimed to be fighting for the Tamil people but did not hesitate to execute fellow Tamils who questioned his authority.

The author dismantles the romanticised image of Prabhakaran with clinical precision. Through extensive interviews and meticulous research, he presents a man who ruled through fear and deception, convinced that he alone knew what was best for the Tamil people.

One of the biggest turning points in the Sri Lankan conflict was India's intervention and its disastrous deployment of the Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF). The book provides a detailed account of how the Indian military, unprepared for guerrilla warfare, was drawn into a brutal conflict against the LTTE, an enemy that fought by its own rules.

The LTTE's tactics were not just brutal but also morally bankrupt. This reviewer had spoken to a senior Indian Army officer who served in Sri Lanka. He was given a chilling firsthand account of how the Tigers operated. In one instance, a convoy of Indi-

an soldiers was ambushed when a remote-controlled bomb blew up one of their trucks, causing heavy casualties.

When the area was searched, a boy was found hiding in a tree, trembling in fear, a remote still clutched in his hands. He had been given simple

instructions — if he saw an Army vehicle cross between two marks on the road, he was to press the button. He had no idea that doing so would kill several people. The Indian soldiers interrogated him, but he knew nothing beyond his small role in the attack.

While this incident reflects the themes explored in the book; how the LTTE's war machine manipulated even the youngest members of the Tamil community, turning them into instruments of destruction. Prabhakaran's biggest blunder, and the one that ultimately sealed his fate, was the assassination of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi. Narayan Swamy delves into the intricate planning behind the murder, the trail of evidence left behind, and how Indian investigators painstakingly pieced it all together.

It all began with an SLR camera found at the assassination site, containing images of Gandhi's final moments, especially one of the suicide bomber, a

woman strapped with explosives, leaning towards him. Prabhakaran, ever the megalomaniac, allegedly wanted photographic proof of Gandhi's death.

With that single act, Prabhakaran turned India from a potential ally into a sworn enemy. The LTTE lost its last source of significant external support. The book illustrates how this marked the beginning of the end for the Tamil Tigers.

For all his tactical brilliance, Prabhakaran was blind to the changing realities of the world. He believed, until the very end, that the Sri Lankan Army could be defeated. He refused to accept negotiations, dismissing any settlement that fell short of full independence. He did not realise that by the 2000s, global patience for violent insurgencies had worn thin.

The author illustrates how, by the final stages of the war, Prabhakaran had become completely detached from reality. As the Sri Lankan Army closed in, he and his loyalists retreated further

into denial. The man who once dictated the course of a brutal civil war now found himself boxed into a shrinking patch of land, abandoned by allies, and despised by the very people he claimed to represent.

His decision to expel thousands of Muslims from LTTE-controlled areas revealed the hypocrisy of his movement. He accused the Sinhalese of ethnic cleansing, yet he was no different. His arrogance led him to believe he could rewrite history. Instead, he became history.

The true tragedy of Prabhakaran's legacy is not his death, but what he left behind. After 25 years of bloodshed, the Tamil cause was in ruins. Sri Lankan Tamils, once a proud and self-sufficient community, were reduced to refugees in their own land. As one former LTTE cadre bitterly admitted, "In 1983, we Tamils were at least standing on our own feet. After a quarter-century of bloodshed, today we are on bended knees".

The only winners in the ethnic conflict were those who fled Sri Lanka and rebuilt their lives in Western countries. For those left behind, Prabhakaran's dream of Tamil Eelam was a nightmare that never ended. The Rout of Prabhakaran is not just a book about a warlord and his downfall. It is a cautionary tale about the dangers of extremism, the perils of blind loyalty, and the devastating cost of a misguided struggle.

Narayan Swamy's narrative is gripping, his analysis razor-sharp. He neither demonises nor glorifies; he simply presents the facts as they are. And the facts make it clear that Prabhakaran was no hero. He was a delusional tyrant who led his people into an abyss. For anyone seeking to understand why the LTTE met its brutal end, this book is indispensable. For those who still romanticise Prabhakaran, it is a necessary wake-up call.

False narrative created over Godhra riots: PM

released on Sunday.

Modi, who was the Gujarat chief minister at that time, said the big incident at Godhra was the spark-point and violence took place. He said that a fake narrative was spread regarding the Godhra case.

“But, the courts investigated the matter thoroughly and found us completely innocent. Those who were truly responsible have faced justice from the courts,” he said.

On February 27, 2002, the Sabarmati Express carrying Hindu karsevaks was set on

fire by a mob, resulting in the deaths of 59 people, including women and children.

This was followed by communal riots across the state of Gujarat, where hundreds were killed.

In 2011, a special court convicted 31 people in connection with the Godhra train burning incident, after which the Gujarat High Court in 2014 upheld the conviction of 11 people while acquitting 20 others.

Finally, the Supreme Court of India upheld the verdict given by Gujarat HC, dismissing the appeals filed by the convicts in connection with the Godhra train

burning

The Prime Minister said his political opponents were in power at the Centre when the violence took place and they were keen to see him punished over the allegations.

“At that time, our political opponents were in power, and naturally they wanted all allegations against us to stick. They wanted to see us punished. Despite their relentless efforts, the judiciary analysed the situation meticulously twice and ultimately found us completely innocent,” Modi said.

The Prime Minister said the most important thing

was that Gujarat, which used to witness violence almost every year, has not seen riots since 2002.

“Over the past 22 years, there hasn’t been a single major riot in Gujarat.

“Gujarat remains completely peaceful,” Modi said. PM Modi said his approach has always been to avoid vote bank politics.

“Our mantra has been, sabka saath sabka vikas aur sabka prayas. We have moved away from the politics of appeasement practised by our predecessors to the politics of aspiration,” Modi said during his over three-hour interaction.

the death count of FC soldiers at five but this could not be verified. He also feared that the death toll and number of injured would rise since several of the injured are in critical condition.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi, and Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti all condemned the attack and expressed sorrow over the loss of lives.

Sharif, in a statement, said: “Such cowardly acts cannot shake our resolve against terrorism.”

He also directed that the injured be provided with the best possible treatment.

“Those who play with the peace of Balochistan would be brought to a tragic end,” Bugti said in an official release.

Minister Naqvi strongly condemned the blast and extended condolences to the victims’ families and wished a swift recovery for the injured.

Denouncing the attack as an act of brutality, Naqvi emphasised that anti-state elements are attempting to destabilise the country. He asserted that such cowardly acts would not shake the nation’s resolve, according to a statement shared by the Ministry of Interior on X.

Balochistan government spokesperson Shahid Rind also condemned the attack “targeting innocents.”

Balochistan has witnessed an uptick in terror attacks over the past year. Bordering Iran and Afghanistan, Balochistan is home to a long-running violent insurgency.

Baloch insurgent groups frequently

carry out attacks targeting security personnel, government projects and the USD 60 billion China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects in this oil and mineral-rich province.

In the past, the railway tracks in this area have been attacked by Baloch militants using rockets or remote-controlled bombs, and the BLA claimed responsibility for most of the attacks.

Earlier last week, in the same province, the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) militants ambushed the Jaffar Express, carrying 440 passengers, near the mountainous terrain of Gudalar and Piru Kunri in Bolan district on March 11. The militants killed 21 passengers and four paramilitary soldiers before the Army eliminated all 33 terrorists on March 12.

The case RC-O1 & O2/2023/NIA/JMU, relates to a heinous terror attack on civilians at village Dhangri, District Rajouri on January 1 2023, followed by an IED blast the next day, the NIA said.

Seven people, including two children, were killed and several others severely

injured in the attacks. The three charge-sheeted LeT handlers had been identified as Abu Qatal alias Qatal Sindhi, Saifullah whose alias include Sajid Jutt, Ali, Habibullah, Nouman and Mohd Qasim.

While Abu Qatal and Sajid Jutt had been Pakistani nationals, Qasim had crossed over to Pakistan around 2002 and had joined the LeT.

Investigations had revealed that the trio had orchestrated the recruitment and deployment of LeT

terrorists from Pakistan to target civilians, particularly from the minority community in Jammu and Kashmir, as well as security personnel. The attacks had been carried out under their directions.

Abu Qatal had come to India in 2002-03 and was active in the Poonch-Rajouri range, along with other terrorists. It was found during investigations that they had provided logistical support to the terrorists on the directions of Abu Qatal.

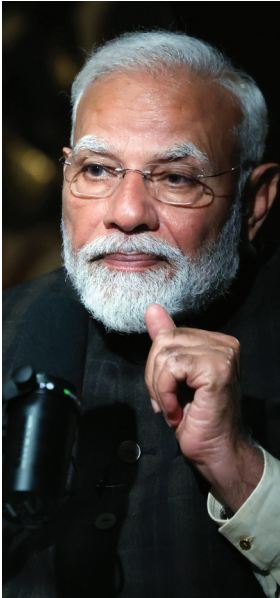

Despite the passage of time, PM Modi noted that Pakistan had continued to wage a proxy war against India, fueled by an ideology that thrived on bloodshed and terror. He emphasised that this was not a matter of ideology, but rather a choice that Pakistan had made, and one that had far-reaching consequences for the world.

Passia assisted him in the act.

A police team led by Jalandhar (Rural) SSP Gurmeet Singh reached the spot and initiated an investigation. However, authorities dismissed the claim of an attack, stating that the incident appeared to be a "fame war" between rival YouTubers. Kartarpur DSP Surinder Pal remarked,

"No gangster is involved. It is just a rivalry between two content creators, who have been engaged in online spats for some time."

DIG Jalandhar Range Naveen Singla stated, "A metal object was hurled at Rozer Sandhu's house, but it was not a grenade. There was no explosion. Forensic examination is underway, and preliminary findings

suggest it was an attempt to create panic rather than a serious attack. We are verifying Bhatti's claims regarding the involvement of Akhtar and Passia."

Mann will complete full term: Kejriwal

of former minister and Chief Khalsa Diwan president, MLA Dr. Inderbir Singh Nijjar.

Speaking to reporters, Kejriwal reaffirmed Mann's leadership, stating, "Mann saab will complete five years, you do not need to worry... he will complete the next five years

as well." His statement was in response to recent claims by Punjab Congress leader Partap Singh Bajwa, who alleged that 32 AAP MLAs were in touch with him and that Mann was in talks with the BJP.

Calling the Mauganj incident which claimed the life of a police official, 'unfortunate' Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav on Sunday stated that the perpetrators of the incident will not be spared. The Chief Minister stated that the senior police officials are present at the spot and the situation is under control.

A police official was killed, and several other police personnel were injured in a mob attack in Madhya Pradesh's Mauganj district. The incident occurred on Friday in the Gadra village of Ramnagari Panchayat of Mauganj district when a police team went to a village to intervene in a clash between two groups and rescue a man who had been held hostage and later killed.

MP CM Mohan Yadav said, "The Mauganj incident is unfortunate. The perpetrators will not be spared... My condolences to the bereaved family.

The by-polls are being held to fill vacant seats in the Legislative Council, and the BJP, aiming to strengthen its presence in the state legislature. Five seats in the state legislative council fell vacant after the existing MLAs won last year's state assembly election.

ter the existing MLAs won last year's state assembly election.

The Election Commission of India announced the details of the bypolls for these five seats on March 3. The sitting MLAs would vote for electing the five new MLCs.

The counting of votes would take place on March 27 after the completion of the voting process. Meanwhile, the Maharashtra Assembly Election last year witnessed a decisive victory for the BJP-led Mahayuti alliance, which secured a landslide win with 235 seats. The results marked a significant milestone for the BJP, which emerged as the single-largest party with 132 seats.

Congress alleges massive land conversion scam in Goa

Goa Congress leader Girish Chodan-Congresskar has accused a senior minister in the Goa Govt led by the BJP of orchestrating a massive scam, alleging that crores in bribes were collected to manipulate land classification. In a strongly worded post on social media platform X, Chodankar claimed that landowners paid over Rs1,000 per square meter to have their properties removed from private forest classifications.

He wrote, "Everyone knows the 'rates'--Rs1000+ per sq. meter--to remove land from private forest & convert zones. Crores in bribes were collected, and now he must return the money! So, what does he do? He wants to waste taxpayers' money to challenge a ruling that protects Goa's land--just to safeguard his investor



friends who paid those heavy bribes." As per the post, "The 'Land Conversion Minister' has been hit with a double setback! First, the Supreme Court stopped the sale of private forests, and now the High Court has crushed his corrupt 17(2) land scam." Despite these rulings, Chodankar warned that the minister is planning to challenge the High Court decision--using taxpayer money--to

protect those who had allegedly paid bribes. "This is shameful! He must be sacked immediately! Goa cannot afford ministers who sell our land for personal gain," Chodankar stated. Meanwhile, India's first-ever auction of exploration licences, a significant reform aimed at unlocking the nation's untapped critical and deep-seated mineral resources, was held in Goa. On Thursday, Union Minister G Kishan Reddy and Chief Minister of Goa Pramod Sawant jointly launched the auction of 13 Exploration Licence blocks, covering critical minerals such as Rare Earth Elements (REE), Zinc, Diamond, Copper, and Platinum Group Elements (PGE). "This initiative, facilitated through a transparent online bidding process, is set to accelerate systematic mineral exploration, enhance private sector participation, and reduce import dependency," said the Ministry of Mines in a statement.

4% quota in contracts for all minorities: DKS

Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Saturday said 4 per cent reservation is for minorities and backward classes, and not just for Muslims.

Responding to a question on BJP's allegation that the government is giving 4 per cent reservation in government contracts to Muslims, the DCM stated, "Who said we are giving 4 per cent to Muslims? It is for minorities and backward classes. Minorities also include Christians, Jains, and others."

Shivakumar defended the move after being accused of appeasement politics by the Bharatiya Janata Party, clarifying that the reservation is not only for Muslims, but for all minorities.

Speaking to reporters at the Karnataka Pradesh Congress Committee's office, Shivakumar said,

"The reservation of contracts for minorities is only up to Rs 2 crores. In the past, similar arrangements

were done for SC/STs. This is for all minorities and not just for Muslims." When asked about the BJP's accusation that the reservation was appeasement politics, he said, "They also need livelihood, right? The BJP must keep remembering us; then only will we become stronger."

The Karnataka Deputy CM is also set to attend the meeting on delimitation called by Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin on March 22 in Chennai. "The (Congress) High Command and the CM (Siddaramaiah) have told me to attend the meet. The CM is not attending as doctors have advised him to rest due to the knee pain. I will be representing the government," he said.

A HOMECOMING FROM THE HEAVENS

In the quiet darkness of early morning, a bright white spacecraft drifted slowly toward the International Space Station (ISS). Inside SpaceX's Crew Dragon capsule, four astronauts from three different countries peered out the windows as the station grew larger against the black of space. On the ISS, NASA astronauts Sunita "Suni" Williams and Barry "Butch" Wilmore were waiting anxiously. This moment was nine months in the making. What was meant to be a routine week-long trip to space had turned into an unexpected odyssey — and now, their ride home was finally here.

AN UNPLANNED MISSION EXTENSION
Williams and Wilmore's journey began in June 2024 with triumph and trepidation. They had launched on the first crewed test flight of Boeing's Starliner — a new spacecraft meant to ferry astronauts to the ISS. The plan was simple: fly to the station, spend a week assisting with tests and logistics, then return to Earth aboard Starliner.

But fate had other plans. Shortly after reaching orbit, Starliner began experiencing serious technical problems — a series of helium leaks and thruster failures that crippled the ship's performance. Mission controllers faced an agonizing decision: they ultimately ordered Starliner to return home empty, without its crew, rather than risk a human ride in a malfunctioning spacecraft. That decision left Williams and Wilmore stranded aboard the ISS, effectively becoming unexpected long-term crew members. What was supposed to be an eight- or ten-day mission stretched out to nine months. NASA quickly reassigned them as part of the station's Expedition crew, integrating them into daily station life. The two astronauts adapted with professionalism and humor. "Eventually we wanna go home... but we have a lot to do up here before we go," Williams said during a live video update, smiling in zero-g. She even joked that the ISS had become her "happy place." Despite the delay, they didn't feel like castaways abandoned in orbit — they felt like part of the team. Their extended mission had purpose. Over those months, Wilmore and Williams became integral

to the ISS crew, performing maintenance tasks like plumbing repairs, computer updates, and even preparing for extravehicular activities. They celebrated milestones far from home — witnessing a U.S. election, Thanksgiving, and Christmas from 260 miles above Earth. NASA ensured they had what they needed: resupply ships delivered fresh clothes, food, and even holiday treats. But the isolation was hard. Wilmore watched his daughter's final year of high school from orbit, and Williams missed the simple feel of Earth under her feet. They knew NASA was working tirelessly on a plan to bring them home — but when, and how, remained uncertain.

CHALLENGES IN MODERN SPACE RESCUE
Devising a return plan highlighted the intricacies of modern space exploration. In the early days of human spaceflight, being "stranded" in space could have meant waiting indefinitely or an emergency evacuation. But today, with multiple spacecraft and international partnerships available, NASA had options — if they could navigate the technical and diplomatic hurdles. Since Starliner was out

of commission, NASA turned to SpaceX's Crew Dragon, developed under the Commercial Crew Program. Fortunately, a SpaceX capsule was already scheduled to fly to the ISS in September 2024 on a routine crew rotation mission (Crew-9). NASA made the extraordinary decision to fly that mission with a "downsized" crew of two instead of four — leaving two empty seats for Williams and Wilmore.

In late September, the Dragon spacecraft — fittingly named Endurance

— arrived at the ISS, delivering NASA astronaut Nick Hague and Russian cosmonaut Aleksandr Gorbunov. The two empty seats were now parked in orbit, awaiting Williams and Wilmore's return. But nothing in spaceflight is simple. Wilmore and Williams couldn't leave immediately. NASA needed to launch a relief crew on another SpaceX Dragon (Crew-10) before they could come home. The Crew-10 mission was scheduled for February 2025, but last-minute technical problems — a set of faulty batteries — forced SpaceX to swap out the capsule for an older, flight-proven model. The delay pushed the launch to mid-March, extending

the astronauts' stay by several more weeks. Through it all, international cooperation proved essential. Crew-10's roster reflected global teamwork: NASA pilots Anne McClain and Nichole Ayers, JAXA astronaut Takuya Onishi, and Roscosmos cosmonaut Kirill Peskov. NASA and Boeing worked to troubleshoot Starliner's issues on Earth, while SpaceX managed schedules and safety checks for Dragon. Russian and Japanese partners not only approved the plan but actively participated in the rescue mission. Communication between Houston, Hawthorne, Moscow, and Tsukuba was continuous, underscoring how the ISS truly functions as a worldwide alliance.

LIFE IN PROLONGED WEIGHTLESSNESS
For Williams and Wilmore, life aboard the ISS became both remarkable and routine. They followed the station's daily rhythm: waking in their sleeping pods as Earth dawned below, working through science experiments and maintenance checklists, exercising two hours a day to stay fit, and ending with an evening conference with mission control. But an extended stay in space takes a toll. Muscles and bones weaken in microgravity because they no longer bear weight. Even with rigorous exercise — resistance machines and jogging on a treadmill strapped in place — astronauts can lose up to 20% of muscle strength and 1-2% of bone density per month. Wilmore and Williams pushed themselves daily on the exercise equipment, knowing they would need to be strong for re-entry. Microgravity also affects cognition. Studies show it can slow down processing speeds and impair attention. Williams and Wilmore occasionally participated in cognitive tests, and while their results showed some slowing, they knew their thinking would return to normal on Earth. The two astronauts leaned on each other and their crewmates, maintaining their humor and professionalism. They found joy in small things: taking photos of Earth, identifying wildfires in California, and shar-

ing inside jokes. Looking out the cupola window at the stars reminded them of why they became astronauts in the first place. That mix of curiosity and resilience carried them through the long wait.

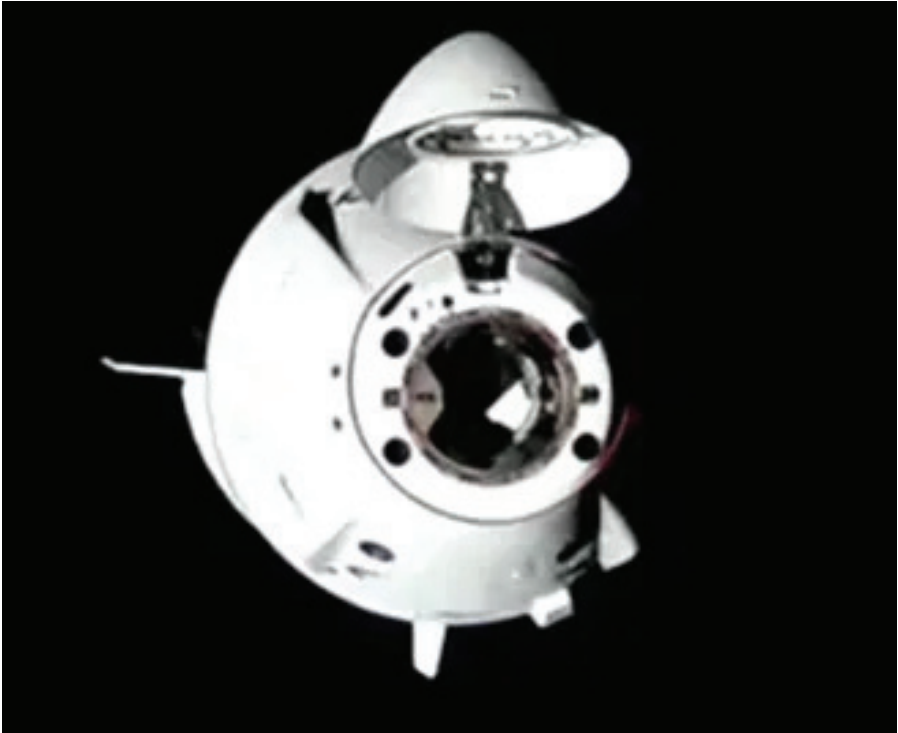
THE DRAGON ARRIVES
On March 15, 2025, their long wait ended. A Falcon 9 rocket roared to life at Kennedy Space Center, carrying the Crew-10 Dragon toward orbit. After a 28-hour orbital chase, the Dragon steadily closed in on the ISS. At 12:04 a.m. Eastern Time on March 16, the Dragon gently docked to the ISS's Harmony module. Even though docking was automated, the moment was tense and emotional. "Contact and capture confirmed," came the call from Houston — and a cheer erupted in Mission Control. Williams and Wilmore shared a relieved embrace. After 270 days in space, help had finally arrived. The station commander presented Williams and Wilmore with a playful award — an "extended mission patch" drawn with a marker — to commemorate their record-setting stay. It was a moment of shared relief and celebration.

HOMEWARD BOUND AND SPLASHDOWN
On March 19, Williams and Wilmore finally undocked from the ISS aboard Endurance alongside Hague and Gorbunov.

A series of thruster burns aligned them with their return trajectory. Re-entry was intense. As the capsule slammed into the atmosphere, gravity returned with crushing force. Plasma created a fiery light show outside the windows. Moments later, Endurance deployed its parachutes and splashed down off the coast of Florida. Recovery teams secured the capsule and opened the hatch. Wilmore and Williams smiled at the rescue crew. After being in zero gravity for nine months, they were carefully lifted out and placed in reclining stretchers. Despite weakened muscles, they gave a thumbs-up and waved to the cameras — they were home.

REHABILITATING EARTHLINGS: RECOVERY AND REFLECTION
NASA's post-landing protocols swung into action immediately. After nine months in microgravity, Williams and Wilmore faced weeks of rehabilitation. They had to rebuild muscle strength and balance through a structured 45-day program. Cognitive tests and vision checks would ensure that any microgravity-related changes were temporary. Emotionally, returning home was a sensory overload — the feel of a breeze, the sound of rustling leaves, the taste of fresh food. Both astronauts reunited with their families — Wilmore hugged his daughter, who had nearly finished high school, and Williams was greeted by her husband and siblings.

LESSONS FOR FUTURE EXPLORATION
This mission underscored the resilience and adaptability required for future space travel. As humanity sets its sights on the Moon and Mars, the ability to handle unexpected failures will be critical. The cooperation between NASA, SpaceX, and international partners showed that a network of spacecraft and global teamwork can make the difference between crisis and success. For Williams and Wilmore, their record-setting mission will be remembered not only as a triumph of engineering but also as a testament to human endurance and teamwork. Their journey home from the heavens stands as a beacon of confidence for the future of space exploration — a reminder that even when the plan changes, the mission can still succeed.

RED SEA ON EDGE: HOUTHIS' WAR BEYOND YEMEN

Houthis' Red Sea attacks, linked to the Gaza war, are disrupting global trade and escalating US-Houthi tensions.

The Houthis, officially known as Ansar Allah, are a Zaidi Shia Muslim rebel group from northern Yemen. The movement emerged in the 1990s as a religious and political opposition to Saudi Arabian influence and what it viewed as the Yemeni government's corruption and marginalization of Zaidis. Over time, the Houthis transformed into a powerful insurgent force. In the early 2000s, the Houthis fought multiple rebellions against Yemen's long-time authoritarian president, Ali Abdullah Saleh, demanding greater autonomy for their northern stronghold. During the 2011 Arab Spring, President Saleh was forced to transfer power to his deputy, Abdrabbuh Mansour Hadi, whose government struggled with political instability. Taking advantage of the turmoil, the Houthis seized the northern province of Saada and later captured the capital, Sanaa, in

2014. In 2015, they expanded their control over western Yemen, forcing Hadi to flee the country. This led to a Saudi-led military intervention, backed by the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and the United States, to restore Hadi's government. Despite years of airstrikes and ground fighting, the Houthis retained control over much of northern and western Yemen.

IDEOLOGY AND ALLIES
The Houthis align themselves with Iran's "Axis of Resistance", which includes groups such as Lebanon's Hezbollah and Hamas. They openly declare their opposition to Israel, the US, and Western powers. Their leader, Abdul Malik al-Houthi, succeeded his brother Hussein al-Houthi, who was killed by

Yemeni forces in 2004. The US and Saudi Arabia accuse Iran of arming the Houthis with drones, ballistic missiles, and cruise missiles, violating a UN arms embargo. These weapons have been used in attacks against Saudi Arabia and the UAE. While Iran denies direct involvement, reports suggest it has helped the Houthis develop domestic drone and missile production. The group also receives military support from Hezbollah, according to US and European intelligence sources.

HOUTHI-CONTROLLED AREAS
The Houthis govern Sanaa and northwestern Yemen, including parts of the Red Sea coastline. Most of Yemen's population lives in these regions, where the Houthis operate a de facto government, collecting taxes and print-

ing currency. Meanwhile, the internationally recognized government is based in Aden, overseen by the Presidential Leadership Council since 2022.

WHY ARE THE HOUTHIS ATTACKING RED SEA SHIPS?
Since November 2023, the Houthis have launched drone and missile attacks on ships passing through the Red Sea, claiming to target vessels linked to Israel, the US, and the UK in response to the war in Gaza. ● November 19, 2023 – The Houthis hijacked the commercial ship Galaxy Leader. Since then, they have launched dozens of attacks, damaging at least 34 vessels. ● February 2024 – The cargo ship Rubymar sank after being hit by a Houthi missile. ● March 6, 2024 – A

missile attack on the Barbados-flagged ship True Confidence killed three crew members. Although the Houthis initially claimed to target Israel-linked ships, many attacked vessels had no connection to Israel. In retaliation for US-UK airstrikes, the Houthis expanded their attacks to ships owned or operated by US and UK companies.

IMPACT ON GLOBAL TRADE
The Red Sea is a critical maritime route, handling nearly 15% of global seaborne trade via the Suez Canal. Due to Houthi threats, major shipping companies have rerouted vessels around Africa's Cape of Good Hope, leading to higher fuel costs, longer transit times, and supply chain disruptions.

US AND UK BOMBING YEMEN

To counter Houthi attacks, the US and UK launched airstrikes on January 11, 2024, targeting drone launch sites, missile storage facilities, and radar systems. ● January 2024 – Initial US-UK airstrikes hit Houthi military positions. ● February 2024 – The US shot down drones and missiles aimed at Red Sea ships. ● March 2024 – Despite continued airstrikes, the Houthis intensified attacks on shipping. President Joe Biden defended the strikes as a "direct response" to attacks on Red Sea vessels, emphasizing that the US aims to protect global trade and maritime security. **FUTURE IMPLICATIONS OF US-HOUTHI CONFLICT** ● The ongoing confrontation between the Houthis and the US risks expand-

ing beyond Yemen. Increased US military action – If Houthi attacks persist, the US may escalate airstrikes or deploy additional naval forces. ● Iran's Role – The US has warned Iran against further arming the Houthis, but Tehran continues to deny direct involvement. ● Regional Stability – The conflict could draw in other players like Saudi Arabia, which has tried negotiating a peace deal with the Houthis since a UN-brokered truce in April 2022. **HUMANITARIAN CRISIS** The war in Yemen has killed over 160,000 people, according to Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project (ACLED). More than 4 million people have been displaced, with Yemen experiencing one of the world's worst humanitarian crises.

WHAT'S NEXT?
While Saudi Arabia seeks a political settlement, the US and its allies remain focused on military deterrence. With the Houthis showing no signs of backing down, the Red Sea remains a volatile hotspot, posing risks to global trade and regional stability.

Abu Qatal- Ghost from LeT who worked in the shadows killed

A significant blow for Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) came in the form of senior terrorist Abu Qatal, alias Qatal Sindhi, who was killed by unknown gunmen in Jhelum, Sindh, Pakistan, on Saturday evening. The killing is a significant setback for the terror group, as he was directly responsible for planning several high-profile attacks in Jammu and Kashmir.

WHO WAS ABU QATAL?
Abu Qatal was a high-priority target for Indian security organizations because of his extensive role in planning and conducting attacks on security personnel and civilians in Jammu and Kashmir. He was well connected with the mastermind behind the 26/11 Mumbai attacks, Hafiz Saeed, and was among LeT's most senior handlers spearheading the terror campaign within the region. One of the most notorious actions he was involved in was the June 9, 2024, bus attack on Hindu pilgrims in Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir. Nine individuals and seven out-of-state pilgrims were killed, and 41 were injured in the brutal attack. Qatal's name also came up in relation to the January 2023 Rajouri attack, where terrorists attacked civilians in Dhangri

village, killing seven people, two of whom were children, and injuring several others. The attack was preceded by an IED explosion the following day, furthering the destruction. His extended engagement in such acts of violence rendered him a prime suspect for various probes by India's National Investigation Agency (NIA). The agency had indicted Qatal in a February 2024 chargesheet, along with other Pakistan-based LeT commanders Saifullah alias Sajid Jutt and Mohd Qasim.

ABU QATAL'S ROLE IN LASHKAR-E-TAIBA
Active in Poonch-Rajouri area since the early 2000s, Qatal gradually moved up the Lashkar-e-Taiba ranks to become a central figure controlling cross-border terror activities. He coordinated attacks by keeping close links with PoK-based

militants. Aside from his personal role in terror operations, Qatal played a key role in the establishment of two proxy terror organizations: 'People's Anti-Fascist Force' (PAFF) and 'The Resistant Force' (TRF). These groups were established to serve as a front organization for LeT and Jaish-e-Mohammed's activities and have plausible deniability. PAFF was designated as a terrorist organization by India's Ministry of Home Affairs on January 7, 2023, due to its role in orchestrating several attacks on civilians and security forces in Jammu and Kashmir. **THE ATTACK THAT LED TO HIS DEATH**
Even though Abu Qatal was enjoying the security cover of LeT militants and plainclothes men, as well as the protection of

Pakistan's armed forces, he was gunned down in the Dina area of Jhelum near Zeenat Hotel. Unknown attackers sprayed his convoy with a number of shots, fatally injuring Qatal and one of his security personnel in the process. Another security guard was left seriously injured during the attack.

IS THE THREAT OVER NOW?
Qatal's demise has been considered a major setback for Lashkar-e-Taiba, as he was spearheading terror activities and was responsible for managing proxy organizations. But security analysts warn that LeT's resistance to change and flexibility could indicate that the group will continue its activities despite the loss of a key figure. Indian security establishments are cautious and vigi-

lance as LeT and its associated networks' circumstances are such since the group's resili-

ence from leadership loss has been well documented previously.

While Qatal's demise weakens the terror group, his violence and violence network

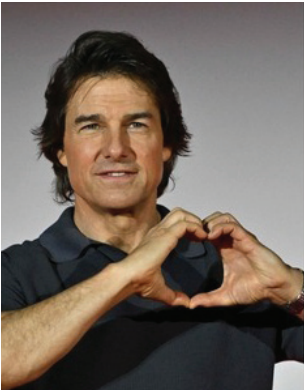


Tom Cruise, Ana de Armas fuel dating rumours with their second appearance

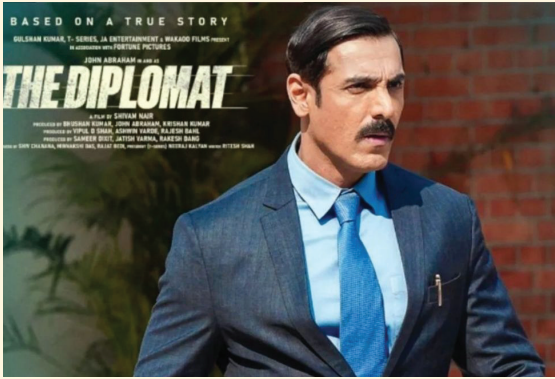

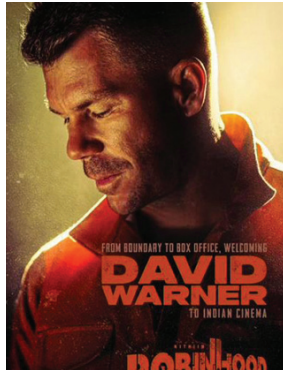

SHEETLA ASHTAMI - A FESTIVAL OF PURITY, HEALTH, AND DEVOTION

Basoda Puja is dedicated to Goddess Sheetla and celebrated on Krishna Paksha Ashtami after Holi. Basoda is also known as Sheetla Ashtami. Usually it falls after eight days of Holi but many people observe it on first Monday or Friday after Holi. Sheetla Ashtami is more popular in North Indian states like Gujarat, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh.

According to Basoda customs families don't lit fire for cooking. Hence most families cook one day before and consume stale food on Sheetla Ashtami day. It is believed that Goddess Sheetla controls smallpox, chickenpox, measles, etc. and people worship her to ward off any outbreak of those diseases.

In Gujarat, the similar ritual as Basoda is observed just a day before Krishna Janmashtami and is known as Shitala Satam. Shitala Satam is also dedicated to Goddess Sheetla and no fresh food is cooked on the day of Sheetla Satam.

Sheetla Ashtami, also known as Basoda, is a Hindu festival dedicated to Goddess Sheetla, the deity associated with cleanliness, hygiene, and protection from diseases, especially smallpox. Cel-

ebrated on the eighth day (Ashtami) of the Krishna Paksha (waning phase of the moon) in the Hindu month of Chaitra, this festival holds immense significance in North India, particularly in Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Haryana, and Madhya Pradesh. Devotees observe this day with great reverence, offering prayers and following unique rituals to seek the goddess's blessings for good health and well-being.

Sheetla (means the "one who cools" in Sanskrit) Ashtami is dedicated to Goddess Sheetla and celebrated 8 days after the festival of Holi.

The Idol of Goddess Sheetla

She is holding a pot of water, a broom with a dust-pan, and Neem leaves. She is sitting on a donkey. The relevance as simply understood is to highlight the importance of cleanliness, staying hydrated, and using herbs such as Neem that act as natural antibiotics for the body.

The Rituals

Since this day falls during the transition from spring to summer, the ritual is to eat meals prepared during the previous day. It is a reminder that this is the last day of the year when you can consume previous days' food.

The upcoming summer season will not allow for the same, with rising temperatures and growth in microorganisms (refrigeration just postpones their growth, but microorganisms are in the air once temperatures rise).

Mythological Significance

The legend of Sheetla Ashtami finds mention in



ancient Hindu scriptures like the Skanda Purana and Bhavishya Purana. According to mythology, Goddess Sheetla is considered an incarnation of Goddess Parvati or Shakti. It is believed that she rides a donkey and holds a broom, a fan, and a pot of cold water, symbolizing cleanliness and the cooling effect she brings to those suffering from heat-induced ailments like smallpox, measles, and chickenpox.

One of the most popular legends associated with Sheetla Ashtami is that of King Birat. According to the story, his kingdom was once struck by an epidemic that caused widespread suffering. Upon seeking guidance from sages, he was advised to worship Goddess Sheetla and observe a fast in her honor. As soon as he and his subjects followed the prescribed rituals, the epidemic subsided, reinforcing faith in the goddess's power to cure and prevent diseases.

Rituals and Observances

Sheetla Ashtami is marked by a unique set of customs and traditions. Unlike other



Hindu festivals, where fresh food is prepared for offerings, Sheetla Ashtami is characterized by the practice of consuming food cooked a day before (Basoda). This tradition signifies the goddess's association with health and hygiene, as well as the cooling properties of stale food, which was believed to be beneficial during the onset of summer.

1. Fasting and Worship

Devotees wake up early, take a holy bath, and visit Sheetla Mata temples to offer prayers. Many women observe a day-long fast, seeking blessings for their family's well-being. The goddess is offered special offerings like curd, rice, roti, jaggery, and sweet dishes prepared a day in advance.

2. Basoda Tradition

The term 'Basoda' literally means 'the day of stale

food.' On this day, families consume food that was prepared the previous night. Popular dishes include puris, kheer, sweet rice, and besan laddoos. This practice is rooted in the belief that fresh cooking generates heat, which might lead to health problems in the warm season.

3. Sheetla Mata Temples and Pilgrimage

Devotees flock to Sheetla Mata temples, such as the renowned Sheetla Mata Temple in Gurgaon, Haryana, and Sheetla Mata Dham in Rajasthan. They offer flowers, turmeric, and vermilion while singing devotional songs and bhajans.

4. Community Feasts and Charity

Many communities organize special feasts where devotees distribute food among the needy. Donations of grains, clothes, and money to the poor are considered auspicious on this day.

5. Avoidance of Fire

One of the key aspects of this festival is refraining from lighting a fire for cooking. The symbolic practice underscores the importance of cooling and relaxation, preventing excess heat generation in the body and environment.

Regional Celebrations

The observance of Sheetla Ashtami varies across different regions, each having its unique customs and beliefs.

1. Rajasthan

In Rajasthan, especially in Jaipur and Udaipur, grand celebrations take place at Sheetla Mata temples. Women prepare large quantities of food a day before and offer it to the goddess before partaking in the meal with their

families. Special fairs are organized, where devotees gather to sing hymns and perform aartis.

2. Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh

In these states, households follow strict fasting rituals. People also bathe in sacred rivers like the Ganges and Yamuna before visiting temples. Folk songs praising Sheetla Mata are sung in villages, and devotees apply turmeric paste as a mark of devotion.

3. Gujarat

In Gujarat, the festival is known as Sheetla Satam, observed a day before Janmashtami. Families avoid cooking and consume cold meals. Special prayers are held in temples dedicated to Sheetla Mata.

Health and Hygiene Connection

Sheetla Ashtami emphasizes the importance of hygiene and disease prevention, a belief that resonates with modern health principles. The festival serves as a reminder of the significance of cleanliness and sanitation in maintaining overall well-being. The practice of consuming pre-cooked food indirectly highlights the necessity of food preservation and safe consumption methods. It also aligns with the idea of giving the digestive system a break by avoiding freshly cooked heavy meals.

Scientific Perspective

From a scientific standpoint, the traditional practices followed during Sheetla Ashtami align with certain health benefits:

- Cooling Effect: Eating pre-cooked food allows the body to cool down, preventing heat-related

illnesses.

- Disease Prevention: The emphasis on cleanliness and hygiene resonates with modern health awareness campaigns.

- Immunity Boost: Observing fasts and consuming simple foods can aid digestion and detoxify the body.

Modern Relevance

Gangaur: Rajasthan's vibrant festival of devotion, tradition, and colours

Observed with great enthusiasm by women, this festival honors Goddess Gauri (Parvati), the consort of Lord Shiva, symbolizing marital bliss, devotion, and prosperity. Gangaur is not just a religious festival but also a grand social and cultural event, bringing communities together in a colorful celebration.

SIGNIFICANCE OF GANGAUR

Gangaur derives its name from 'Gan' (Lord Shiva) and 'Gaur' (Goddess Parvati), representing the divine union of the two deities. The festival is primarily observed by married and unmarried women, who pray for the well-being of their husbands or future spouses. It is believed that Goddess Parvati observed rigorous penance to win the love of Lord Shiva, making this festival a symbol of dedication, love, and harmony in married life.

Gangaur holds immense importance in Rajasthan, where women observe fasts, dress in traditional attire, and participate in processions, making it a spectacular event that showcases the state's rich heritage.

DURATION AND TIMING

The festival lasts for 18 days, starting from the first day of Chaitra (March-April) and concluding on the third day of Shukla Paksha in the same month. Gangaur

is celebrated with great enthusiasm across Rajasthan, especially by women, as a festival dedicated to Goddess Gauri (Parvati), symbolizing marital bliss, devotion, and prosperity. The festival lasts for 18 days, starting from the first day of Chaitra (March-April), and involves a series of rituals, fasting, and grand processions.

KEY RITUALS AND TRADITIONS OF GANGAUR CELEBRATION

1. CLAY IDOLS AND WORSHIP

- Women create and decorate clay idols of Lord Shiva and Goddess Gauri at home.
- These idols are worshipped daily with devotion, using flowers, wheatgrass, and sacred offerings.
- The worship continues for 18 days, with special songs and prayers dedicated to the goddess.

2. FASTING AND DEVOTION

- Married women observe fasts for the well-being of their husbands.
- Unmarried girls also fast, praying for a suitable life partner.
- Some women eat only one meal a day, while others follow more rigorous fasting traditions.

Applying mehendi (henna) on hands and feet is an essential part of Gangaur, symbolizing prosperity and marital happiness. Women dress in colorful lehengas, odhnis, and traditional jewelry, reflecting the grandeur of Rajasthan's royal heritage.

3. SONGS AND FOLK PERFORMANCES

During the festival, women sing traditional Gangaur songs, narrating tales of Goddess Parvati and her devotion. Folk performances, including Ghoomar dance and puppet shows, add to the festive spirit.

On the final day, grand processions take place across Rajasthan, with beautifully adorned idols of Gauri and Shiva carried in decorated



palanquins. These processions are accompanied by traditional music, folk dances, and vibrant celebrations.

Sinjala is an essential part of Gangaur, celebrated with great enthusiasm, especially among women. It takes place a day before the main Gangaur festival and is a symbol of love, prosperity, and

togetherness.

1. EXCHANGE OF GIFTS

Sinjala is a day when married women receive gifts from their parents or in-laws. These gifts typically include traditional attire, jewelry, cosmetics, and sweets. This gesture is a token of love and blessings for a happy and prosperous married life.

2. MEHENDI AND TRADITIONAL ATTIRE

Applying mehendi (henna) on hands and feet is an integral part of Sinjala. Women adorn their hands with intricate henna designs, which are believed to bring happiness and good fortune. They also dress in colorful traditional out-



fits, such as lehengas and odhnis, making the festival even more vibrant.

3. SPECIAL DELICACIES

Sinjala is incomplete without delicious traditional sweets. Ghewar, malpua, and gujiya are among the special treats prepared and exchanged among family members and neighbors. These sweets add to the festive spirit and are enjoyed by everyone.

4. SOCIAL GATHERINGS AND FESTIVITIES

Women come together to celebrate Sinjala by singing folk songs, performing Ghoomar dance, and sharing joyous moments with family and friends. The festival fosters a sense of unity and strengthens social bonds.

India ends Special Olympics Games with 33 medals

He was roped in by Delhi Capitals for Rs 50 lakh for the upcoming IPL season.

"I am really happy to back at the Delhi Capitals, I am excited to join the side and to play with everyone. I will

treat the game as important as the last one. I didn't change much at all, I just trusted the process and kept it going throughout the tournament and that's what was planned for this season," Nair said during an interaction with media.

"I will find my process, my rhythm as soon as I can and I will like to start well early and will try to get better as the tournament goes on. The only thing that I have done is playing according to the situation, added a few shots and built the confidence to execute them when needed. I also now try to stay relaxed," he added.

Fiery spells from pacers Jacob Duffy and Kyle Jamieson did not allow a new-look Pakistan led by Salman Agha to kickstart their new era with their fearless cricket as intended, and the visitors were crushed by nine wickets in the first T20I on Sunday. Pakistan's most significant defeat while batting second also occurred against the Black Caps at Wellington in 2016. In the match, New Zealand posted a total of 196-5, and Pakistan was dismissed



for 101 in 16. 1 over, falling to a record loss by 95 runs. Pakistan's worst men's T20I defeats, batting first in terms of balls remaining, first against the Kiwis on Sunday, March 16, second came back in 2018 at Harare against Australia, where AUS won by nine wickets, balls remaining in that match was 55. Pakistan's worst men's T20I defeats batting second in terms of runs. Pakistan's biggest loss in terms of runs

also came against the Kiwis; their second biggest defeat came against Australia back in 2012 at Dubai. Australia won the match by 94 runs. This was Pakistan's lowest total in NZ, outdoing their 101 against the Kiwis at Wellington back in 2016. The 2025 Champions Trophy was where Pakistan was the host and was also the first team to be eliminated from the tournament. After CT 2025, Pakistan went to New

Zealand with fresh faces and a new captain, Salman Agha.

Pakistan came into the match featuring a revamped top order, having omitted veterans Mohammad Rizwan and Babar Azam from the team after thier failures in the Champions Trophy. Nevertheless, they experienced a disastrous beginning. Pakistan struggled against the Kiwis, and their batters found it difficult to bat against the NZ quickies.

PCB issues legal notice to Bosch for breaching contractual obligations

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has served a legal notice to South African all-rounder Corbin Bosch for breaching his contractual obligations with the Pakistan Super League (PSL) on Sunday.

Corbin Bosch was selected by Peshawar Zalmi in the PSL player draft on January 13 in Lahore. However, Indian Premier League (IPL) Mumbai Indians had also signed him as a replacement for his compatriot injured Lizaad Williams.



Bosch's signing means he will forgo his PSL contract, as the IPL begins on March 22 and overlaps with the PSL's April-May schedule. According to the report, the player is alleged to have violated the terms of his contract. Pakistan Cricket Board has sent a legal notice to all-rounder Corbin

Bosch through his agent. The PCB management has outlined the implications and potential consequences of his withdrawal from the 10th edition of the Pakistan Super League. "Bosch was picked by Peshawar Zalmi in the Diamond category during the tenth edition of HBL PSL Player Draft, held in Lahore on 13 January," the PCB said in a statement on Sunday. "The legal notice was served through his agent, and the player has been asked to justify his actions of withdrawing from his professional and contractual commitments."
